Happy New Year,

We are fortunate in have Doug Wilson as the new Editor of *The Spiral*. The exact format is being worked out so there is no guarantee that this represents the final version.

As of this writing, the enrollment of the Academy stands at 214 members, an increase of 39 members over the first semester. It's my opinion that at least a portion of the increase is due to the timely distribution of this semesters Learning for Life catalog.

In addition to having Doug assume the position as Editor, we are pleased to announce that Judy Perkins and Elizabeth Majors have accepted the Chairmanship of the Public Relations Committee and have been confirmed by a vote of the Board members. Jack Romeo formerly held this position. Judy and Elizabeth have already been active in distribution the current catalog to various businesses in the area and have talked to the Editor of the Aiken Standard in an attempt to obtain better coverage of Academy events. In addition to securing greater exposure of Academy events, it is an additional goal of the Public Relations Committee to increase enrollment by bring the Academy to the attention of newcomers to the area and to long time residents who are unaware of our mission.

Larry Peyser has formed a Nominating Committee that will provide a slate of candidates for the offices of President-Elect, Curriculum Chair-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Nominating Committee also is seeking someone to assume the position of Membership Chairperson, currently held by Elayne Kantor. The Nominating Committee's results will be presented to the Board of Directors at the Board's February meeting and announced in the March Spiral. The election will be held at the March General Meeting following a request for nominations from the floor. If there is more than

one nominee for a position, a paper ballot will be utilized. Otherwise, a motion to accept by acclamation will be in order. New officers will be announced in the April Spiral and introduced at the April Program meeting. The new officers will assume their duties on July 1st.

Monthly Meeting, February 8, 2:00 PM:

Secretary of State Rice has made "transformational diplomacy" a priority of her tenure. What does "transformational diplomacy" really mean and how has it changed the way the State Department does business around the world? Is it a concept that is likely to endure into the next Administration? Taylor Ruggles will address these and other questions as he looks at how the world of diplomacy is shaping up in the 21st century. A reception follows the talk in Penland 110.

Treasurer's Report: The report reflected the payout for past commitments to the endowment fund and to the scholarship fund. The report was accepted. The Board members reviewed the budget for 2008-2009. A motion was passed to

approve the increase of instructor/lecturer fees from \$50 to \$75. The budget was unanimously approved.

It was announced that Academy classes would be held on MLK day (Jan. 21).

Elayne Kantor reported that plans are finalized for the 2008 holiday luncheon, which will be held on December 12th at the Woodside Plantation Country Club.

Members discussed the importance of ongoing publicity and outreach to the community regarding the Academy and its activities. The board, pending approval by the membership, has selected Judy Perkins and Elizabeth Majors to handle the position of Publicity Co-Chairpersons following the resignation of Jack Romeo.

Vince Coughlin introduced Doug Wilson as the new editor for the *Spiral* newsletter.

Larry Peyser reported that the nominating committee has been chosen. Doug Wilson is the chairperson with members Pat Vestal, Joan Sundt and Jerry Sundt. The Board approved this selection.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:30p.m.
