The new officers' terms will begin this July.


Note that **one vital office remains unfilled**, that of President-Elect. The President-Elect performs the duties of the President in his/her absence, oversees the formation and election of the Nominating

Commander Richard Jadick, USN, to speak at April Academy Members Meeting

Doctor Jadick won the Bronze Star with Combat V for Valor for his service in the Iraq war. He is the only Navy doctor to have been awarded this combination so for in the Iraq conflict.

A graduate of Ithaca
College and the New York
College of Osteopathic
Medicine, and a former
Marine officer, he went on
to work as a resident at the

Cowley Shock Trauma Center in downtown Baltimore. Now a urology resident at the Medical College of Georgia, he is still in the Navy.

Jadick is the author of On Call In Hell (A Doctor's Iraq War Story).

Doctor Jadick will speak of his experiences working

around the clock to save Marines wounded in the battle of Fallujah. He went to the wounded. It is believed 30 Marines would have died without his emergency care at the battle front. Only one Marine died after reaching a hospital, among the hundreds Doctor Jadick cared for. He is truly an American hero. Doctor Jadick and his wife live in Augusta.

Date Change for "Made in China"

Dr. "Holly" Han will present the final two sessions of *Made in China: An Introduction to Chinese Tourism and Theatre Arts*. Dr. Han is not only a professor in Kunqu Performing Arts at the National Academy of Chinese Theatre Arts, but also an actress in the Beijing Kunqu Opera Theatre. Dr. Han will explain the differences between Chinese and western opera and she also will discuss makeup, staging and performing. Her first class will be on Thursday, March 27 at 10am in P106 and the second class will meet at the same time and place on April 3. **Note that this is a date change from the published course catalog.**

March Board Meeting Summary

- The meeting of the Board of the Academy for Lifelong Learning was called to order at 12:31pm
 March 14, 2008 by Vince Coughlin, President.
 Those present were Vince Coughlin, Mike Lythgoe, Larry Peyser, Roy Wright, Elayne Kantor, Jack Perkins, Erna Arkin, Doug Wilson, Laura Anderson and Deidre Martin.
- Secretary's Report: The February minutes were read and accepted.
- Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was read and accepted.
- Deidre Martin of USCA participated in a discussion regarding scholarships. The Academy would like

to provide financial help to students just below the 3.0 GPA cutoff that makes them ineligible for a Life Scholarship, who otherwise would have to drop out of USCA for financial reasons. Deidre assured the Board that the University's financial aid services are experienced in determining how to award financial aid to those students who fall below the 3.0 GPA and that we could designate any financial assistance we provide as being for "retention" scholarships. In view of this discussion Larry Peyser made a motion to provide \$2500 in "retention" scholarships for the upcoming academic year. The motion was unanimously passed by the Board.


- A motion was made and seconded that an additional \$2500 be donated to the University Endowment Fund. The motion was unanimously passed by the Board.
- We returned to last month's discussion of using funds from the Julie Thurlow Watson Endowment Fund to purchase items of use to the Academy. The items proposed by Mike Lythgoe were a podium and lavaliere microphone for use in Penland 106. The podium would be identified as being provided by the Academy in the event it "walked" out of P106. Vince Coughlin reported that the USCA Media Resources Specialist provided Mary Anne Cavanaugh with the specifications for a Carvin microphone with transmitter and receiver that is compatible with the sound system in P106. The cost of the sound system is about \$500. The purchase of both items was approved. Deidre Martin will send an appropriate letter of notification and appreciation to the family of Ms. Watson.
- Vince Coughlin said that he received a letter from Jenny Horn, the USCA Development Coordinator containing a pledge reminder for 2008 - 2009. We have made an annual donation of \$1000 to this scholarship each year and it was moved that the Board approve the scholarship, in the amount of \$1000, for the upcoming academic year. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed by the Board.
- Doug Wilson reported that the Nominating Committee had been unable to find anyone to step forward for the position of President-Elect. The election will continue as scheduled and we will continue efforts to fill this position.
- There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:29pm.


NON-ACADEMY ITEMS WHICH MAY BE OF INTEREST:
