The History of Polo in Aiken - Taught by Pam Gleason, active polo player, publisher of The Aiken Horse newspaper and editor of Aiken Polo Club Magazine, this course will explore the history of polo as it relates to Aiken

The Formerly Soviet South: The International Politics of the Caucasus and Central Asia - The collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991 resulted in eight newly independent states in the Caucasus and Central Asia. This course will explore the domestic and international politics of these, often unstable, newly independent countries on the southern periphery of Eurasia. Dr. Tom Wood, USC Aiken Department of History and Political Science, will teach this course. Dr. Wood has lived in former Soviet Central Asia and researches the region.

Relativity and the Genius of Albert Einstein - The course is structured around Einstein's "thought experiments," which ask very simple questions about common events leading to Einstein's profound conclusions. This instructor is George Hummert, Ph.D. from Carnegie Mellon, an Electrical Engineer who spent most of his career at the Westinghouse Research Laboratory in Pittsburgh, and has lived and worked in Aiken since 1993. This course is intended for a general audience, and will not include mathematical descriptions.
