# Doug Wilson Honored as 2010 Kauffman Award Recipient

Each year since 1992 the Academy has presented the Earl Kauffman Award to recognize laudable individual contribution to the organization.



You know this year's honoree Doug Wilson as Editor of *The Spiral*. Do you also know that Doug served on the 2007 Nominating Committee, is a member of the Curriculum Committee, and contributes articles to the *Aiken Standard Mature Times*? During his spare time this academic year he has coordinated and docu-

mented the Academy By-Laws and Policies and Procedures changes. These contributions plus his untiring willingness to help whenever and wherever he is asked to support the Academy and its efforts have all supported the Board's decision to recognize Doug this year.

After graduating from Purdue University with a degree in Mechanical Engineering Doug joined and served Dow Chemical Corporation for the next 32 years. He spent his entire career developing, improving and managing foam packaging production and engineering. He worked to become a globally recognized expert in the field of cushioned packaging. As such he was called upon to develop and implement in-house and industry training programs, speak to Government, Industry and Education organizations, and develop computer software to ease the process of engineering and producing environmentally safe packaging materials.

Doug met his wife Sherry while he and she were students at Purdue. His work assignments caused them to live in Michigan and Ohio where Sherry served as a school teacher over a period of twenty-five years.

After retirement they purchased a fifth wheel trailer and toured several areas of the country. They moved to Aiken in 2004 partly on the strength of the fact that the University offered programs in continuing education.
