# President's Message

This September is the 22nd year the Academy for Lifelong Learning has offered courses for senior members of the CSRA, all in conjunction with the University of South Carolina Aiken. Many of the lecturers are from the University's faculty, others from members of the community.

This semester the Academy offers 13 courses and 4 special events including art, history, literature, poetry, politics, music, science, birding, Hitchcock Woods history, wine tasting and trips.

In August, the Academy featured a special exhibit of information and artifacts at the Aiken County Library highlighting courses taught over the past decade. In addition, a summary of courses was featured in the August 17 issue of the Aiken Standard, and another article will be featured in the August 31 issue of the *Mature Times* supplement to the *Aiken* Standard. ### 60 Plus Seniors Program

The USCA Wellness Center has a wonderful program dedicated to the senior population. The mission of the 60 Plus Seniors Program is to enhance the quality of life of the participants by providing supervised programs embracing healthy lifestyle choices.

The program includes scheduled class times to utilize the entire Wellness Center. The classes are 1 hour and 15 minutes in length, beginning at 8am and ending at 12pm. Meeting times are every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Members must choose and adhere to a specific class time. All of the classes are limited to 55 members.

The program also includes optional aerobics, strength, yoga, stretch and balance classes. The classes are lead by qualified instructors and are geared toward the senior population.

To qualify for the 60 Plus Seniors Program, applicants must be a minimum of 60 years old, complete an initial meeting with Woodrow Price, Special Programs Coordinator, complete a medical history and informed consent, and have their physician complete a medical release form.

Fees for the 60 Plus Seniors Program are currently set at \$120 per year or \$60 per 6 months. Membership fees are due on May 1 and November 1. Membership fees can be prorated if a new member joins in between the membership due dates.
