Board Meeting September 23

President Dick Baxter called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. Those present were Mary Anne Cavanaugh, Glenn Knowles, Kathy Schulz, Wesley Sloan, and Doug Wilson.

Norb Denil, Gerry McDonald, Marcia McDonald and Faculty Liaison Dr. Kathleen Kalpin-Smith were not in attendance.

Motion to approve the minutes of August 12, 2011 carried.

Treasurer's Report

In Norb's absence, there was no Treasurer's Report presented. Mary Anne has mailed the most recent Level 1 report to Treasurer Norb Denil. She has not received a response.

Committee Reports

<u>Curriculum</u> – There are 16 confirmed courses for Spring 2012. There is also a need to recruit a Curriculum Chair Elect and additional committee members. Criminology and Local History, Debt in the U.S., need liaisons.

Hopefully there will be 19-20 courses. There is an October 14 deadline for setting Spring classes, with October 7 as the final Curriculum Committee meeting before the deadline.

There is difficulty planning Power Point presentations at Cedar Creek because there is no dedicated digital projector. The available projector belongs to Cedar Creek Realtors and is not always available.

<u>Publicity</u> – Dick Baxter is the acting Publicity Chair. There was another article in the *Mature Times* insert to the *Aiken Standard* in September. Dick is doing a good job, but it would be better if a Publicity Chair could be recruited.

The Academy web site is up and running at www.aiken-learning.com with Doug Wilson as webmaster. The catalog is available on the website. All but 10 print copies of the Fall catalog have been given out to date.

Membership — Registration stands at 44 individuals signed up for two semesters and 90 individuals registered for the Fall semester only, for a total of 134 members. Income is down by over \$3,000 from last year. We hope to have a vigorous spring.

As many members have e-mail accounts, but prefer a printed catalog, there needs to be a discussion with Gerry McDonald about having additional printed catalogs vis-àvis electronic catalogs.

There have been no contributions to the Academy for Lifelong Learning Scholarship Fund as listed in the Fall catalog.

Old Business

The Academy members really need to recruit a Curriculum Chair Elect.

The schedule for Board Meetings for the Fall semester are set to begin at 10:00, October 14, and November 11. Before the end of the semester the Board needs to decide if a 9:30 start time would be more convenient.

At the annual Senior Extravaganza, 21 people asked to be put on the catalog mailing list.

President Dick Baxter and President-Elect Gerry McDonald met with USCA Chancellor Tom Hallman. There has not been a single classroom added in the last ten years even with increased USCA enrollment. The Chancellor will look into getting a designated computer for Penland 110.

New Business

The Steeplechase request for \$410 was rejected by USC-Columbia. They only approved \$375 based upon individual attendance. This is \$35 short of the cost of those requesting Steeplechase tickets plus the cost for rail space. Kathy Schulz has resubmitted a revised request. There was a motion made and unanimously accepted that if the revised request is rejected, the Academy take the \$35 difference from our checking account. .

Because of lagging attendance there will be no General Membership Meetings during the Fall semester. There

will only be the two General Membership Meetings in the Spring required by our bylaws (election of officers and Kauffman Award).

Doug Wilson will put in The Spiral that Academy members on a course wait list should not attend unless they have been notified that a spot has opened.

The meeting adjourned at 11:30.
