As I write this, 8 of the courses and 2 special events are scheduled to be completed by the end of October. Courses continuing into November, or staring into November, include "The Poetry of Philip Levine: The Blue Collar Poet of Detroit", "Understanding the Nutcracker - An insiders Look", and "Three Women of Science, Marie Curie, Irene Joliet-Curie, and Lise Meitner". [Editor's Note: "Three Women of Science" has subsequently been canceled.] The Holiday Luncheon is scheduled for December 2. All of the courses, to date, have been interesting, informative and well attended.

For Publicity, an article for the *Mature Times* supplement to the *Aiken Standard* is scheduled for publication on October 26.

The Curriculum Committee has developed a program offering 19 courses and 2 special events for the Spring 2012 semester The 750 catalogs are scheduled for distribution during the first week of December. This is an increase of 6 courses over the Fall semester and covers a broad range of interests.

A new computer and LCD projector has been installed in Penland-110. Computer student assistance will be provided for all lectures using the computer - LCD system.

Marcia McDonald and Faculty Liaison Dr. Kathleen Kalpin-Smith were not in attendance.

Motion to approve the minutes of September 23, 2011 carried.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Norb Denil has taken care of new signature cards and deposited board member checks in the checking account.

Until further notice the Academy will not be making scholarship pledges. The Academy expects to pay USCA our \$3,885 debt from Spring 2011 semester by this November.

Committee Reports

<u>Curriculum</u> – For Spring 2012 there are 19 courses, 1 wine tasting, and a 1½ hour trip down the Savannah River. The fee is set at \$15 person and Academy members are welcome to bring guests and food for the trip.

<u>Publicity</u> – Filling in for our lack of a Publicity Chair, Dick Baxter has submitted another article for *Mature Times*.

He will work with Michael Gibbons to have Academy events put in the *Aiken Standard* calendar. At the election of officers general membership meeting, photographs need to be taken for a feature newspaper article.

For the current semester 750 copies of the catalog were printed. Of these 250 were mailed to previous members and existing members who do not have e-mail. The remainder of existing members were sent e-mail copies. 500 were distributed through various other means. It was recommended that more effort be placed on deciding which people receive e-mail vis-à-vis hard copy.

<u>Membership</u> – Membership Chair Kathy Schulz has arranged for a harpist to perform at the December 2 Holiday Luncheon at Houndslake Country Club.

Old Business

There is now a designated computer and projector for Penland 110.

Since the Spring 2012 semester has classes at 11:00 on Friday, the Board should consider holding meetings at 9:30 rather than 10:00.

We still need to recruit a Curriculum Chair Elect. Academy members should be encouraged to consider serving and ask other members to serve.

New Business

Since on multiple occasions there have been technical difficulties in the middle of a class, course liaisons should NOT let the lecturer dismiss the designated student technology helper before the end of class.

There are generally two reasons why enrollment in specific classes is limited: 1) the available room has limited seating and 2) the instructor requests a class limit. Liaisons should discourage people not on the waiting list from attending classes in classrooms with limited seating. This should be placed in the next edition of *The Spiral*.
