November Board Meeting

President Dick Baxter called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. Those present were Mary Anne Cavanaugh, Glenn Knowles, Gerry McDonald, Kathy Schulz, Wesley Sloan, Doug Wilson, and Faculty Liaison Dr. Kathleen Kalpin-Smith.

Marcia McDonald was not in attendance.

After a recommendation that the Secretary have a first draft available by the 15th of each month, a motion to approve the minutes October 14, 2011 carried.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Norb Denil has tendered his resignation. The Board voted to transfer the Treasurer's title and responsibilities to Mary Anne Cavanaugh. She will have interaction with the Board acting as a Finance Committee. In light of this decision the Board will discuss financial matters including a budget at the January 13th meeting.

The Academy still owes \$3,885 to USC Aiken for last semester. The Board voted to pay that indebtedness by the end of November.

The Board will discuss Membership dues at its meeting in January, after the December Level 1 report is available.

Committee Reports

<u>Curriculum</u> – The next meeting is January 6th. The goal is to increase the number of classes to 20 for Fall 2012. For Spring 2011 there are 4 classes in Penland 110. Of these 2 were requested for a smaller classroom than Penland 106.

<u>Publicity</u> – Dick Baxter is submitting another long article for the *Mature Times* monthly insert in the *Aiken Standard*.

For the Spring semester Quality Printing will print 750 copies of the catalog at a cost of \$600. Of these 250 will be mailed to previous members and existing members, who do not have e-mail. The remainder of existing members will be sent e-mail copies. 500 will be distributed through various other means. For the Fall semester 50 copies went to existing members and 200 to previous members. Laura will be encouraged to closely consider which people receive e-mail vis-à-vis hard copy. The catalog will be ready for mailing by December 1. Laura Anderson will have an electronic version.

In the future the catalogs should have a date to mark the beginning of registration.

The Board voted to have Mary Anne Cavanaugh create an inexpensive generic Academy Business Card. The card will include the Academy logo, the Academy website, and USC Aiken contact information. There will be between 500 and 1000 printed depending on pricing breakpoints.

Membership – A harpist has been paid to perform by Mike Lythgoe at the December 2 Holiday Luncheon at Houndslake Country Club. President Dick Baxter will mention the Academy's stand-alone website www.aikenlearning.org and copies of the catalog will be available at the Holiday Luncheon.

Old Business

Since the Spring 2012 semester has classes at 11:00 on Friday, the Board voted to hold meetings at 9:30 rather than 10:00.

We still need to recruit a Curriculum Chair Elect and a Publicity Chair. All Board and Curriculum members should be encouraged to contact other members, friends, and neighbors to serve!!!

For the Kauffman Award on April 20th, Glenn Knowles is encouraged to contact Bruce Capers, basketball coach at Aiken Technical College and Vince Alexander, basketball coach at USC Aiken as potential speakers.

President Thomas L. Hallman has the Kauffman Award Luncheon on his calendar.

The Board voted to give a faculty or staff member a \$25 gift certificate for service to the Academy for Lifelong learning.

New Business

On April 10th Shizuo Z. Kuwahara from Symphony Augusta will give a presentation on *The Conductor's Job*. The Board voted to invite members of the Aiken Symphony Guild to attend. This will give them an opportunity to learn what Academy classes are like.
