Academy Board Meeting, January 13

President Dick Baxter called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. Those present were Mary Anne Cavanaugh, Glenn Knowles, Gerry McDonald, Kathy Schulz, and Wesley

Marcia McDonald, Faculty Liaison Dr. Kathleen Kalpin-Smith, and Doug Wilson were not in attendance.

Motion to approve the minutes of November 11, 2011 carried

Treasurer's Report

Mary Anne Cavanaugh, who currently holds the position of Treasurer, gave the Treasurer's Report.

The Academy has paid its indebtedness to USC Aiken for last semester.

As of year end we have \$18,067.57 in the University Account. There is a Purchase Order outstanding for Great Decisions Materials. Because of USC regulations and the unique nature of the course, there are "extra hoops" for Great Decisions Materials. These materials include a set of topical DVDs, a Teacher's Guide, and 31 copies of the Great Decisions 2012 Briefing Book. As of the Board Meeting Great Decisions Materials have not been received. There are 22 people registered for Great Decisions 2012, but additional students may register for this course. For the past several years this class has always been full, sometimes with a waiting list.

\$3,290 is owed to USC for membership and \$2,700 to USC Aiken professors. The amount owed for membership may increase depending on the final membership figures.

Including non USC Aiken instructors that leaves approximately \$8,500 after expenses.

In large part because of the resignation of the previous Treasurer and the Board decision to move treasurer responsibilities to USC Aiken Continuing Education personnel, the Academy does not have a budget for the Spring semester. Mary Anne is to work up and put some structure into a budget for the February Board Meeting.

There is approximately \$2,100 in the checking account. Previous Treasurer Norb Denil still has signature authority.

After the end of the Spring semester, Mary Anne is to work up a tentative budget for 2012 – 2013 beginning July 1, 2012.

Committee Reports

<u>Curriculum</u> – The next meeting is February 3rd. There are tentatively 16 to 17 classes currently listed for next semester. The goal is to increase the number of classes to 20 for Fall 2012.

<u>Publicity/Marketing</u> – Dick Baxter is submitting monthly articles for Mature Times. There was a Mature Times article on December 28 and one scheduled for January 25

There is a Board concern that Academy Business Cards not be in so small a font as to need a magnifying glass in order to be read. The card will include the Academy logo, the Academy website, and USC Aiken contact information. There will be between 500 and 1000 printed depending on pricing breakpoints.

<u>Membership</u> – There are 185 members registered for Spring 2011. There is a slight increase of "Spring Only" members from 2010.

There are four classes with waiting lists. Either the instructor or passenger limit determined the number for two of these. The remaining two were limited by space available.

The Aging Brain was filled the first day registration forms were received. The Curriculum Committee should encourage the instructor to offer the course in the future with a larger class size and/or additional sections of the same course.

The class with the most registered members is *The Roman Empire* with 86. The class with the least registered members is *Wine Tasting with 11*. Both of these numbers are surprises.

Old Business

Elections are in the near future. The Academy still does not have either a Curriculum Chair Elect or a Publicity Chair. All current Academy members should be encouraged to volunteer to be Curriculum Chair, Curriculum Chair Elect, or Publicity Chair.

Given the available amounts in the University and checking accounts, the Board considered what should be done with the funds. The options presented were: reduce membership fees, increase instructor compensation, or provide undergraduate scholarships. Given past experience where encumbered funds were NOT available, the Board decided to hold the accounts without changing either income numbers or expense numbers. A minimum of \$2,700 needs to be kept as a "safety net."

The Kauffman Award will be on April 20th . Bruce Capers, basketball coach at Aiken Technical College, will be the featured speaker. He should bring a lot of excitement. The award winner was selected, but naturally, the name is not listed in these minutes.

There will be a special award for outgoing President Thomas L. Hallman.

New Business

The menu, invitees, and location of the Kauffman Award luncheon should be determined by the mid-February meeting.

It should not be expected that all members will use the Academy website. Since we expect it to be utilized at a greater extent in the future, efforts should be made to publicize the Academy website address.

A Nominating Committee needs to be selected for the 2012 – 2013 year. Emphasis should be placed on positions, which were not filled for the current year.

The next Board Meeting will be February 10th, 9:30 am, in Business & Education room 102.

The meeting adjourned at 11:20.
