# Academy Board Meeting, February 10, 2012

President Dick Baxter called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM. Those present were Glenn Knowles, Gerry McDonald, Kathy Schulz, Doug Wilson, and Wesley Sloan.

Mary Anne Cavanaugh, Marcia McDonald, Faculty Liaison Dr. Kathleen Kalpin-Smith, were not in attendance.

Motion to approve the minutes of January 13, 2012 carried after some discussion.

### Treasurer's Report

Dick Baxter, Mary Anne Cavanaugh, Gerry McDonald, and Doug Wilson have been named as the Finance Committee. Gerry McDonald has developed a tentative format for presentation to the Board. There is nothing wrong with the Management Information Report - Level 1, but it is difficult to interpret vis-à-vis Lifelong Learning.

There is approximately \$1,800 in the checking account. Previous Treasurer Norb Denil did not have to be present at Security Federal in order to turn over checking account signature authority.

### **Committee Reports**

<u>Curriculum</u> – The next meeting is scheduled for April. Gerry has developed a survey. Most questions are tweaked from previous surveys, often using the same language. The survey asks both general and specific topics for potential classes.

A previous Astronomy class, *Exploring the Heavens*, taught in February 2011, had a limit of 35. It quickly met its limit. Since we have a membership of approximately 200, Dr. Gary Sean has been asked and agreed to teach another class during the coming Fall semester.

In the same vein this semester's class *The Aging Brain* with a limit of 15 filled the first day. The instructor, Dr. Echo Leaver, should be asked if she is willing to teach again. If she wants to keep the class size at 15, perhaps she would be willing to give multiple sessions.

Cedar Creek should be considered every time it is available and Penland 106 is not available. Except in the case of an instructor who is a current faculty member, this is even when it was NOT mentioned in Curriculum Committee meetings.

<u>Publicity/Marketing</u> – Publicity is encouraging. Articles submitted to the *Aiken Standard* have regularly been printed in *Mature Times*.

Board Members, Curriculum Committee Members, and the general membership should be encouraged to bring a guest to a class especially when the class is in Penland 106 or other classroom with plenty of available seating.

A motion was made and passed that Doug Wilson should mention in *The Spiral* "invite a friend to class." Doug will put a map on the Academy Website: http://www.aikenlearning.org/index.php.

Membership – As of the Board Meeting membership stands at 198. This compares with 222 for the previous 2011 total. This is a drop of approximately 11%. The number of people who paid for annual membership, as

compared to one semester at a time, is 50% of the previous year.

The *Cruise the Savannah River* trip is full. Kathy Schulz will send a memo to participants giving directions and inviting them to bring water and light refreshments

Nominating – John and Nancy Meinhardt are serving as the current Curriculum Chair Elect. They will begin the position of Curriculum Chair July 1. The Nominating Committee is still looking for somebody for the position of Curriculum Chair Elect for the next academic year.

Gerry McDonald will be President and Dick Baxter Past President. Nobody has agreed to accept the position of President Elect.

Kathy Schulz and Wesley Sloan agreed to maintain their current positions.

#### **Old Business**

The March 9 General Membership Meeting will have outgoing President Thomas L. Hallman as the featured speaker. For many years President Hallman has given a State of the University presentation to a General Membership Meeting. He has been a great supporter of the Academy. For example one week after a problem with the lack of a computer in Penland 110 was mentioned to Dr. Hallman, a computer was installed.

The Spiral should have an article encouraging attendance in order to honor his service to the Academy and USC Aiken. Course liaisons should be encouraged to make an announcement at the beginning of each class.

The Kauffman Award will be at the last General Membership Meeting of the semester on April 20th . Bruce Capers, basketball coach at Aiken Technical College, will be the featured speaker. He is a former member of the Harlem Globetrotters.

#### **New Business**

The use of the new computer in Penland 110 appears to be intuitively obvious to the casual observer. This semester it has been increasingly difficult to get computer help for Penland 106. The computer and microphones, both hand held and wireless, have been a problem.

In the past USC Aiken computer guru Barry Ready has provided a training session to all members of the Curriculum Committee. Since the campus computer system often changes, the Board would like to request that Barry train Board Members and Curriculum Committee Members at the beginning of each semester.

Jim Brown of Senior Net has been contacted to determine if they are interested in supplying personnel for the computer system in Penland 106 for the next Fall semester. The intent is to have a computer person available for each course using the computer in Penland 106.

In order to differentiate semester catalogs, the Board proposes an orange cover for Fall and a green cover for Spring.

The Curriculum Committee does not plan to have a March meeting unless absolutely necessary. If the

Board of Directors has a March meeting it will be on March 9 before the General Membership Meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 11:50.
