#### SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING

President Gerry McDonald called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM, September 14. Those present were Dick Baxter, Mary Anne Cavanaugh, John Meinhardt, Nancy Meinhardt, Doug Wilson, and Wesley Sloan.

Faculty Liaison Dr. Kathleen Kalpin-Smith and Kathy Schulz were not in attendance.

#### Treasurer's Report

Financially the Academy has improved dramatically over the last two years. From a time when there were not enough funds available to pay our obligations to USC Aiken nor fund scholarships for USCA students, both the University account and the checking account now have adequate balances. The Board is now considering either reinstating scholarship money or again providing funding for the university's "First Year Reading Experience" program.

### **Committee Reports**

<u>Curriculum</u> – The next meeting is scheduled for October 5 with final course schedule and descriptions due by October 8.

For the current semester there were five courses with waiting lists: Acrylic Painting, Bella Italia, Comparative Religion, Exploring the Heavens, and Movers and Shakers of South Carolina. In some cases the class size was limited by request of the instructor. In other cases the class size has been limited by classroom availability. This is the second time we have offed Exploring the Heavens, the last time being February 2011. Each

time it has ben closed out. If Dr. Gary Senn is willing to repeat the course we should consider offing multiple sections.

In addition to the five courses with waiting lists two classes, John James Audubon and South Carolina and Three Women of Science, were cancelled because of last minute unavailability of the instructors. Each of these instructors has been extremely popular in the past and we hope they will be able to teach in the future

The Healthy for Life class was scheduled for Penland 110, but appeared in the catalog in Penland 106. When a handful of people did not attend the first class, email was sent to them explaining the room change.

In past surveys personal finance had been one of the top vote getters. However during the current semester Essentials of Financial Planning is scheduled for Penland 110 and is only about half full. Another personal finance class has been proposed for next semester. It passed the initial cut in the Curriculum Committee. The topics of the proposed class are different from the current class. This leaves a dilemma. Our target is 20 classes for Spring. We are only slightly over halfway there. Do we want to have an additional personal finance to bring or total closer to 20 even though there was not enthusiastic support this semester? President Gerry McDonald is doing some research and promised to have information available before October 8.

Membership – Kathy Schulz was unable to be present. Sadly because of health reasons Kathy and her husband will be moving to the other side of the Savannah. Both Kathy and her husband have been tremendous assets to the ALL. As of the Board Meeting membership stands at 162. This compares with 133 for the previous Fall Semester and 199 for Spring Semester 2012 total.

<u>Publicity/Marketing</u> – A draft newspaper advertisement was presented for the semester starting in January, 2013 to the Board. With minor corrections it was approved.

In a discussion about the Senior Extravaganza at Odell Weeks it was determined that it was a lot of work with little or no return on our investment of effort.

#### **New Business**

President Gerry McDonald met with Dr. Sandra J. Jordan, the fourth chancellor of USC Aiken. Dr. Jordan is a graduate of the University of Georgia where she earned her doctorate in art history with a specialty in Baroque period iconography. Art and Art History are popular with Academy members, but it is often difficult finding instructors. The Academy for Lifelong Learning looks forward to working with Dr. Jordan as she leads USC Aiken into the future

The meeting adjourned at 11:50. The date of the next meeting of the Board of Directors will be determined as the need arises.
