USCA's Dr. Deidre Martin awarded 2013 Earl Kauffman Award

Every year since 1992, the Academy for Lifelong Learning has given an award in the name of Earl F. Kauffman, one of the key founders of the Academy in 1989. The award is given to a group or individual that has provided outstanding service to the Academy or to the Senior community in general. This year's recipient, announced at an Academy luncheon on April 18, is University of South Carolina Aiken Vice Chancellor of University Advancement, Dr. Deidre Martin.

From her beginnings as a farm girl in Omega, GA, Dr. Martin went on to graduate Magna Cum Laude with a double major in communications/public relations and home economics from Berry College in Rome, GA,. She proceeded on to Georgia



State University where she again graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Masters in Education, and received her Doctor of Education in Curriculum and Instruction from University of South Carolina with an impressive 4.0 GPA.

Dr. Martin has has held office, and been an active representative for the University, in many community groups and activities, including Kiwanis, the American Association of University Women, Aiken United Way, and the Greater Aiken Chamber of Commerce. Her impressive list of accomplishments and awards is literally too large to mention here.

Over the years, Dr. Martin has been a strong advocate of the Academy for Lifelong Learning and has helped garner support from the University's leadership.

Kauffman Recognition Day Luncheon

Sixty-two Academy members and guests attended this year's Kauffman Recognition Day Luncheon on April 18.

Academy President Jerry McDonald led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance, then introduced Aiken Mayor Fred Cavanaugh, who gave the opening invocation.



Following lunch, President McDonald then shared some remarks



about the unique synergy between The Academy, USC Aiken, and the Aiken community. Recognition was given to the Academy's Curriculum committee who are really the heart of our organiza-

tion, and to the current officers and other volunteers who help keep our wheels turning. Jerry also recognized the contributions of the USCA Continuing Education Department, under whose auspices we operate, as well as those USCA faculty members and others from the community that have shared of their time and expertise to help lead our courses.

Following Jerry's remarks about Dr. Earl F. Kauffman and his role as one of the founders of the Academy for Lifelong Learning, USCA Vice Chancellor for University Advancement Deidre Martin shared some remembrances of Dr. Kauffman and her involvement with him.

Past President Dick Baxter then announced the recipient of this year's Kauffman award, Deidre Martin, and brought her back to the podium to receive her award (see separate article in this issue of *The Spiral*). The event concluded with our keynote speaker Dr. Sandra Jordan, recently installed as USCA's new Chancellor. Dr. Jordan entertained us with her thoughts on Aiken, pine pollen, and coming to a quality small



school like USCA from larger universities. Dr. Jordan brought us up to date on USCA's focus on its students and plans to help develop them as leaders of tomorrow, emphasizing skills and knowledge that will be particularly useful in our surrounding community in the future.
