USCA Continuing Education Department Reorganization

The retirement as full time USCA employees of Mary Anne Cavanaugh and Laura Anderson has triggered the school to look at reorganizing and possibly expanding the Continuing



Education Department. The University is considering a consolidation of numerous related functions currently scattered among different departments. At this writing, the reorganization plans are still being worked out. USCA has assured us that the Academy of Lifelong Learning is a valuable and cherished addition to their programs, and that this reorganization will not result in a long term loss of University support for the Academy.

In the short term, Laura Anderson has agreed to continue working part time as the University's daily interface with the Academy, at least through the Fall 2014 term. She will be dealing with only the Academy and Senior Net, not with the full range of activities she



supported in the past. Laura will handle emails sent to the office daily, but will be present in the office only Mondays through Wednesdays from 9 am to 5 pm. In addition, she will be assisted by a student intern.

Until the reorganization is finalized and implemented, we may find email responses and phone call returns taking a little longer than we're used to. Your understanding, tolerance, and cooperation will be appreciated during this transition period.

The Academy Sponsors Its First Aiken City Summer Concert





JULY 23, 2014 Board Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President Carl Fields.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Laura Anderson

The Treasurer position is currently vacant due to the retirement from USCA of Mary Anne Cavanaugh. An informal report was presented by Laura Anderson.

The carry-over balance from the 2013-2014 academic year is quite adequate to fund any anticipated expenses prior to the receipt of this year's membership fees.

When USCA Faculty members choose to be paid for teaching Academy classes, we pay them directly at our standard rate, plus the university bills us for their overhead, another 40% or so. When we pay non-faculty instructors, it only costs us the direct instructor fees.

Board members are reminded, when signing up for the Fall, to write separate checks for membership fees and any activity fees. Board membership fees are to be written to "Academy for Lifelong Learning" and will be used to fund the Academy checking account for the year. Payment for any activity fees for Board members should be made to USCA, as they go into the general Academy account at USCA.

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE REPORT - Jan VanSlyke

The Fall catalog has been submitted to the printer, with target delivery date first week of August.

There is one class assignment change: Cold War class had to be moved to Penland 110. The change has been submitted to the printer but we don't know if it will make it into the catalog. If it doesn't get into the catalog the change will be announced in The Spiral and on the Academy website, and any affected enrollees will be advised of the change in their registration confirmation letters.

With the force reduction in the USCA Continuing Education Department, at least through the transition period to their new configuration, the amount of support we can anticipate for the Fall semester, and possibly longer, will likely be reduced. Full time Mary Anne and Laura in the past will now be Laura just three days a week, plus one student intern. Consequently, the course liaisons will be asked to assume some larger responsibilities. This will be discussed at upcoming Curriculum Committee meetings.

PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT

We're on track for the Academy-sponsored event Southern Nights Jazz Orchestra Aiken City concert at Hopelands Gardens on August 18. Doug Cook will make some introductory remarks promoting the Academy. Also, fans promoting the Academy will be passed out to attendees. Note there has been some confusion re the spelling of the entertainment group, with early information from the city calling the performing group "Southern Knights".

Incomplete plans for editorial placement in the Life In Woodside publication carry over to this year. Ideal placement would be the months before our semester registrations start, i.e. August and December. In addition, Laura informs us that there is a sister publication for Cedar Creek, so we may be able to get similar placement in both with minimal extra work.

OLD BUSINESS

USCA Continuing Education Reorganization

USCA Vice Chancellor Deidre Martin updated us on progress regarding the reorganization of the USCA Conferences and Continuing Education Department. Mary Anne Cavanaugh is fully retired and will not be back. The Department is being expanded to reduce fragmentation in handling USCA facilities and to bring facility management together under one roof. With this change in scope, the reorganization is taking longer was than initially anticipated. With regard to the Academy during this transition, Laura Anderson will continue in the office Mondays through Wednesdays at least through December, handling only the Academy and Senior Net. Laura will be assisted by a student intern. Laura will have access to her university email account from home on other days as well. Dr Martin stressed that USCA considers the Academy to be an important part of its community outreach and that it will continue to be supported by the University.

With Mary Anne's retirement now established, it was discussed that the Board consider issuing a proclamation in appreciation of her years of service to the Academy. An appropriate venue and format to be determined later.

NEW BUSINESS

Treasurer Vacancy

The retirement from USCA of Mary Anne Cavanaugh has left us with a vacancy in the Treasurer position. This being between normal election dates, under the provisions of our Bylaws, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed to have Laura Anderson fill this position.

Future Board Meetings

Curriculum Committee sessions will continue on the first Friday of each month. Default dates for Board meetings will be on the third Friday of the month so that they follow the Curriculum meeting and any curriculum items requiring Board action can be dealt with. Laura will reserve meeting rooms for these dates.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 11:08 am.
