The University has a need for the use of Penland 106 on dates where we had classes scheduled in that auditorium. As a result the following courses have moved to new venues:




Curriculum Committee Short Handed

More on Last Semester's Aiken Veterans of WW II course

Last semester, associate professor in the USCA English department Dr. Douglas Higbee presented an Academy course, *Aiken Veterans of World War II*, about wartime experiences of World War II veterans from the Aiken area. The interviews upon which the course was based were collected in a US Library of Congress program sponsored locally by the Augusta Richmond County Historical Society.



A collection of these local stories, *In Their Own Words: Augusta and Aiken Area Veterans Remember World War II*, was published a few weeks after the class ended. Dr. Higbee served as one of the editors of the book which includes additional local stories not covered in the Academy class.

MINUTES

Minutes of the prior Board meeting, held May 19, 2017, were approved without change.

TREASURERS REPORT - Amy Grizzle

Last meeting we were looking for an explanation of the substantial balance decrease in our operating account from the previous month. Doug C obtained data from Laura Anderson showing it was made up of:

We have not yet been billed for mailing costs of physical catalogs.

Carry-over balance from last year was sufficient to cover these expenses. This August's carry over is about the same as last year's, so that means the Academy essentially broke even for the last academic year.

In addition, Karen brought us up to date on the latest (Aug 1) spendable balances on our various Endowment funds.

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE REPORT – Harriet Haynes

The 2017 Fall catalog was printed and mailed according to schedule, with release on August 1. Abby also emailed copies to the email list that same day. Doug W reported that website updates for the new semester went "live" July 31, including the downloadable catalog and online calendar.

For the upcoming Spring semester the Committee is working on 27 short courses and 3 trips.

The Curriculum Committee is down to about 12 active members and there is a need to add to this group. A flyer soliciting new Committee members will be placed in B&E 124 on registration days.

Karen reported that for registration days, all registration materials containing financial information (credit card numbers or attached checks) must be handed directly to USCA staff members and not to Academy volunteers. This is to maintain USCA accreditation for fund handling.

PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT

As her final act, outgoing Publicity Chair Nancy Meinhart submitted a nice article regarding our upcoming Fall semester which was published in the *Aiken Standard*. Abby reported she had received quite a few phone calls as a result of the article, from both current and prospective members – mostly inquiries re when the catalog would be available.

At this point we still have no replacement for Nancy. The need for a Publicity Chair will be included in the flyer on registration days.

OLD BUSINESS

Software Update

The Active Network installation is underway and is expected to be completed by the end of the week. Active Network training of USCA personnel is in progress. As there is insufficient time for debugging, the Academy will not be using Active Network for Fall registration, but USCA intends to use it for around 50 of their own online and external programs this fall to give it a good shake down. If all goes as planned the Academy should be able to switch over to Active Network from the current antiquated Student Manager software to handle registration and class assignments for the Spring term. The main benefit for our members is that we can offer them online registration, including credit card payment. There are additional internal capabilities and office procedure efficiencies that will benefit the Academy and USCA as well.

Administrative Assistant

At our last meeting in May, USCA was still in the recruiting and selection process for a new Administrative Assistant to replace Amy Westra who left in November. Laura Anderson had returned from retirement to help out in the interim.

The process was completed in June and Abby Grizzle was hired to fill this void. Laura has agreed to continue long enough to provide a smooth transition. The Board has been working with Abby this summer in preparation for the Fall semester and to say we are very pleased with her capabilities and personality is putting it mildly.

NEW BUSINESS

Academy Treasurer

Academy bylaws state that a vacancy in office occurring between elections shall be filled by a vote of the Board. The Board elected USCA Administrative Assistant Abby Grizzle as Academy Treasurer and welcomed her to the Board.

Checking Account

Balance in the Academy checking account (used for petty cash expenses and charges that either must be paid more quickly than the USCA system can deliver, or for items that cannot be charged via USCA credit card) is thought to be sufficient for several years, based on past usage. Accordingly the Board voted to suspend diverting Academy membership fees for Board members into this fund for the time being.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 am. The next Board meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, September 20 at 9:00 am in B&E 102.
