Our Spring 2018 catalog is in its final review and again has a variety of courses for all interests. It should be available the first part of December. Watch our website for its publication and registration information.



USCA Parking Policy Update – Must Have Parking Permit Decal on Windshield

USCA recently announced that all students, including Academy members, must display USCA parking decals in their windshields when parking on lots on

campus during school hours. Violators are subject to fines and/or having their vehicle towed. Note that students still must park in spaces marked by white lines; spaces marked by yellow lines are reserved for faculty and staff.

IMPORTANT: Academy Mailing List Update



Beginning with the distribution of the January 2018 issue of *The Spiral*, the Academy will be going to a new email management system as part of a major software update for

the USCA Continuing Education Department. (More on the software update next month ..) Only those who are registered with the Academy for the current Fall 2017 semester will automatically be carried over into the new email system.

If you are registered with the Academy for the current Fall 2017 semester:

You will continue to receive *The Spiral* and any other general Academy-related emailings from USCA come January.

If you are NOT registered with the Academy for the current Fall 2017 semester:

You will NOT automatically continue to receive Academy emailings beyond December 2017.

Several Classes affected by Schedule Disruptions

MINUTES

Minutes of the prior Board meeting, held August 3, 2017, were approved without change.

TREASURERS REPORT - Abby Grizzle

Our account reflects the registration fees from 260

members this semester. The balance is sufficient to cover existing expenses: Instructor pay, copy expenses for handouts, fall catalog mailing expenses.

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE REPORT – Harriet Haynes

The committee is working on 32 short course ideas for Spring 2018, plus 4 trips. Roughly half of these are completed. The deadline for getting all information together for the Spring 2018 catalog is October 30.

Four class sessions were canceled September 11 and 12 due to Hurricane Irma. We are in the process of contacting instructors about rescheduling these sessions and coordinating with USCA on classroom availability.

PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT – Jan Van Slyke for Rachel Pirkle

Rachel has submitted an article to *Mature Times* for September.

The October issue of our newsletter, *The Spiral*, will come out in mid-September due to Doug W's impending 3 week vacation starting Sept 16.

OLD BUSINESS

Active Network

The Active Network software is now up and running at USCA and is being used for fall Continuing Education programs and events. We anticipate being able to use this for Academy registration and course management beginning with the Spring 2018 semester.

Once the Academy goes to it, Active Network will be used for managing emailed communications. The software will automatically handle any registrations made through it, but additional names can be added by importing from a spreadsheet. It was decided that we should pre-load the list with only the registrants from the current Fall semester, with no carry-over of the hundreds of additional names that are currently on the mail list. Doug W will add a note with the December (and possibly November) distribution of *The Spiral* that we are going to a new mail management system beginning in January and that any non-registrants currently receiving the mailing will need to contact us to be added to the new list in order to continue receiving our e-mailings.

Joel joined us for a review of the Active Network capabilities, with emphasis on email handling. There was some discussion of sending out test emails via the Active Network system prior to the end of this semester, but definitive plans were not made.

NEW BUSINESS

Publicity Chair

The Board voted to install volunteer Rachel Pirkle as the new Publicity Chair, filling the vacancy created by Nancy

Meinhardt's resignation at the end of last semester.

Cancellation policy due to weather, etc.

Our current Policies and Procedures document says if USCA cancels classes, Academy classes held on campus at the same time will also be canceled. As a result of Hurricane Irma, questions were raised regarding classes held offcampus. After some discussion it was decided that this policy should be applied to off-campus sessions as well, both to simplify the process and because if the campus is closed, there will be nobody in the office to answer questions or notify participants of the status of off-campus sessions. Secretary Doug W will draft a proposed change to the Policies and Procedures document for approval at a future Board meeting.

Academy for Lifelong Learning references on USCA website

The Academy page on the USCA website, which is linked-to from the Continuing Education Department page, has been static for several years. Since we have our own website which is constantly updated with current information, it was suggested that the USCA page is now redundant and possibly should be eliminated in favor of merely having the link on the Continuing Education page go to our website. If USCA considers the USCA page for the Academy to be necessary, it should do no more than give a basic description of what the Academy is about and give a link to our website. Abby will contact intern Joel Aitcheson on this matter.

Signs for Academy classes and events held outside normal classrooms

The Board approved purchasing several signs, similar to real estate placards, that can be used to mark Academy locations when classes or events are held in locations other than traditional USCA classrooms.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 10:05 am. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday November 15 at 9am in B&E 102.
