#### **Online Registration**

#### NEW BUSINESS

#### Officer Slate for Next Year

Kathy Rachick will progress from Chair-Elect of the Curriculum Committee to Chairman. Doug Wilson is willing to continue as Secretary and his two non-Board positions (Newsletter Editor and Webmaster). Jan Van Slyke has already had two consecutive terms as President and deserves a chance to step down. We need to really start canvassing for people willing to serve as President, President-Elect, Curriculum Chair-Elect, and Publicity.

#### Parking Permits

Discussion continues with the campus Police re parking permits for our non-faculty instructors. We do not feel it is realistic for an instructor who may only be coming on campus to teach one or two class sessions to have to plaster a 2-year parking permit to the windshield. We are proposing that a simple paper hang tag should suffice for such instructors. Doug C will try to get with the Police Chief to get this resolved in the next few days.

#### Classroom Computer Training for Liaisons

We need to have all class liaisons familiar with the audio-video equipment in our classrooms, so it is suggested that the Curriculum Committee schedule one or more hands-on sessions in conjunction with Committee meetings on a regular basis. In addition, it would be a good idea to have instructions on laminated sheets permanently placed in the classrooms, reflecting any idiosyncrasies for that particular room (Penland 106 especially). It is also strongly suggested that instructors bringing in presentations on thumb drives or who are bringing in video resources receive instruction prior to their first day of class.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:17 am. The next meeting is scheduled for February 21.
