Alexia Helsley Interviewed on South Carolina ETV



By the River is a current series produced by South Carolina ETV and USC Beaufort which features interviews with Lowcountry authors. The October 4 episode was devoted to USCA historian and popular Academy instructor Alexia Jones Helsley, author of Wicked Beaufort.

During the course of the program she shares insights on such diverse topics as growing up in Beaufort, historical archiving in the electronic age, and going to school with author Pat Conroy. Alexia also divulges she is working on a book about Aiken. If you watch closely, you'll even get a glimpse of the fanciful costume she wore for the opening session of her Fall 2014 Academy course *The Vikings And Their World*.

October was Horse Racing Month at the Academy



Several courses and events last month centered on horse racing.

October's "horsey" offerings began with a session of the *Aiken Backstretch Experience*, a program run by Aiken Parks and Tourism to

explore Aiken's horse racing heritage and to provide insight into what takes place at the Aiken Training Track.



The group learns about initial stall training of young thoroughbreds at Legacy Stable. In this phase of their training the horses get acclimated to wearing bridle and saddle, accepting weight on their backs, and taking direction from their trainers.



At the Aiken Training Track, Lisa Hall, tour leader and Director of the Aiken Thoroughbred Hall of Fame and Museum, discussed the fine Montmorenci sand found in the area that makes Aiken such an ideal spot for horse training.

The group gathers to observe the grave of Blue Peter, a champion thoroughbred that trained in Aiken. He was sired by War Admiral and was grandson of Man 'o War. Of his ten races he had eight first place and two third place finishes, including a win at the 1948 Belmont Futurity. Blue Peter was named American Champion Two Year Old Colt by Turf and Sport Digest that same year. He was favored to win the Kentucky Derby but had to withdraw due to an intestinal illness which eventually claimed his life in 1950.



Blue Peter is buried in a full horse-sized casket beneath the iconic live oak which now bears his name in the infield of the Aiken Training Track. He is one of 40 Aiken-trained champion horses currently honored at the <u>Aiken Thoroughbred Hall of Fame</u>.

Local author Sasser Hill's *Publishing, Mysteries and Horses* course followed, started in mid-October. While the course centers on her publishing experience, Ms Sasser cites her novels which have been mysteries involving the horse racing industry.

The Academy had its usual railside spot for the 27th running of the *Aiken Fall Steeplechase*, the last Saturday of the month.

One more offering relating to horse racing was the much-anticipated *World of Thoroughbred Racing* course to be given by racing legend and local icon Cot Campbell. Unfortunately this was postponed for two weeks then eventually canceled. The Academy is greatly saddened by Mr. Campbell's death at his home at age 91 on October 27, the same day as the Steeplechase.

TREASURERS REPORT - Joel Aitchison

Joel is arranging for payments for those classes and events for which we are billed. Our account balance is sufficient to cover any anticipated expenses this semester.

We have now received the updated spendable balance figures for this year on our various endowment accounts.

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE REPORT - Kathy Rachick

The Committee feels the registration process went much better this semester with no major glitches. We had 256 registrations as of last week's Curriculum meeting. There was a training session on the audio-visual equipment, and the committee felt they needed to have a handout guide in the event support personnel are not available to help with problems. The new amplifier and microphone worked very well when we had our first classes last week.

Kathy plans to represent the Academy at the Aiken Senior Extravaganza to be held September 19.

Revised copies of the Liaison Guidelines, Instructor Guidelines, and Office Contact info have been distributed to the Committee. The revised forms will be used with any new instructors this semester, and will go into general use next semester.

For Spring 2019, the Committee is working on approximately 28 courses at this point.

PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT – Jeanmarie Bronson

Jeanmarie is looking for ideas for a Mature Times submission for October. She is planning a November article covering our Steeplechase event and requests someone provide her with some photos.

OLD BUSINESS

Catalog Mailings

(Carry-over from last month) Kathy requested a cross-reference of catalog mailings vs enrollees. Karen feels that the mailing list is fairly clean. The topic was again tabled pending Doug Wilson's return, as it was felt he had more knowledge of how the list was trimmed last year.

Microphones and Speakers

The new system has been used in several classes and has been effective. The Board voted to purchase a second system for use as a backup, and for when we have consecutive classes in separate locations on campus.

NEW BUSINESS

Concern about the load on Doug Wilson

Harriet brought up the load being carried by Doug Wilson, who fills the positions of Board Secretary, editor of The Spiral, and Webmaster. The group thought that if Doug wished to part with some of these duties, that the Secretary position would most likely be the easiest to fill.

This morphed into a discussion of using the email capabilities of the Active Network software to send one or more broadcasts soliciting for people to join the Curriculum Committee or to express interest in serving on the Board.

Holiday Reception

Last year, Doug Cook and Abby worked out the details for the reception (what foods and beverages to order from Aramark and their quantities). It is thought Abby left a checklist behind for future planning purposes. Kathy thought the decision made by email to charge \$15 per non-Academy guest was too high.

Last year's purchase list will be obtained from Aramark to help in our planning.

Rescheduling classes canceled by Hurricane Florence

The hurricane closed campus September 11 and 14. We are fortunate in that only two individual class sessions were affected. The original classrooms are available to extend each of these classes an additional week. Liaisons will need to check with the instructors to see if this will work for them.

Scholarships

In recent years we have funded two \$2000 scholarships for non-traditional students at USCA. Our Procedures call for us to meet with the USCA Advancement group each fall to plan our scholarship contributions for that school year. This is our way of giving back to the University.
